

Does your Congressman vote for you? Significant Items from Randy Hultgren's Voting Record

2011-112th Congress

1/7/2011-vote AYE on H.R.26 bill introduced to repeal the Affordable Care Act
2/17/2011-vote AYE on Amendment 42 to H.R.1 reducing funding for the National Endowment for the Arts by 20.594 million
2/18/2011-vote Aye on Amendment 85 to H.R.1 prohibits the use of funds for Planned Parenthood (defund Planned Parenthood)
3/17/2011-vote AYE on H.R.174 prohibit federal funding of National Public Radio

2012-112th Congress

9/14/2012-vote AYE on H.R.6213 this prohibits the Dept. of Energy from issuing any new loan guarantee of innovative energy projects.
9/21/2012-vote AYE on H.R.3409 Stop the War on Coal Act of 2012 which prohibits any regulation adversely impacting employment in coal mines, or cause a reduction in revenue by reducing quantity, or designate any area unsuitable for surface coal mining.

2013-113th Congress

2/28/2013-**vote NO on S.47 to renew the funding of the Violence Against Women Act** Passed 286-138
6/19/2013-vote NO on H.Amdt.176 to H.R.1947 to restore the \$20.5 billion cuts in SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). Failed 188-234

2014-113th Congress

7/10/2014-vote AYE on H.Amdt.993 to H.R.4923 to reduce funding for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy Programs by \$22 million. Failed 129-290
7/10/2014-vote AYE on H.Amdt.1040 to H.R.4923 to prohibit the use of funds to design, implement, administer, carry out assessments regarding climate change. Passed 229-188

2015-114th Congress

1/22/2015-vote AYE on H.R.7 No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion. Federal funding for abortion has been prohibited (Hyde Amendment) this bill would prohibit abortion in any federal health care facility or by a federal employee (think VA). It also denies premium assistance tax credits or health insurance tax credits for any health plan that covers abortions. This applies to individuals who pay their own premiums for insurance but receive any type of tax credit or assistance under the Affordable Care Act. Passed 239-183
2/3/2015-vote AYE on H.Res.70 of H.R.596 which was the 60th attempt to repeal the Affordable Care Act. Passed 242-176
3/26/2015-votes NO on H.R.2 Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 which renewed the authorizations of the expiring law and revised the way doctors are paid under Medicare, the first time changed since 1997. Passed 392-37.

5/13/2015-vote AYE on H.R.2048 the USA Freedom Act restoring provisions of the Patriot Act and mandates the FISA court release "novel" interpretations of the law, and makes the FISA court common law as legal authority for deciding cases and for allowing or restricting surveillance conduct. Passed 338-88.

9/10/2015-vote AYE on H.R.411 which was a vote against the U.S. nuclear treaty with Iran. Passed 245-186.

9/17/2015-vote AYE on H.R.421 a bill to defund Planned Parenthood. This bill was based in part on highly edited "sting" videos submitted by a pro-life advocacy group that has repeatedly been debunked.

2016-114th Congress

1/12/2016-vote AYE on H.R.1644 STREAM Act which prohibits the Dept. of Interior from issuing any rule regarding prohibited surface mining areas near streams. Passed 235-188

2/2/2016-vote AYE on H.R.3762 a bill to repeal the Affordable Care Act AND stop funding for Planned Parenthood. Failed 241-186

3/15/2016-vote AYE on H.R.3797 a bill to require the EPA to allow the same number of emissions allowances for sulfur dioxide as previously allocated instead of reducing allowances. Passed 231-183

2017-115th Congress

2/2/2017 vote AYE on H.J.R.40 overturning the law signed during the Obama Administration prohibiting an individual who receives Social Security benefits through a representative payee from owning a gun. Passed 235-180 and signed into law.

3/16/2017-vote AYE on H.R.1181 Veterans 2nd Amendment Protection Act which prohibits VA from sending names of individuals to the FBI or NICCS only if a judge, magistrate, or other judiciary authority determines an individual a danger to themselves or others. A 2016 VA report found that in 2014, 67% of veteran suicides were caused by firearms. Passed 240-175.

3/28/2017-vote AYE on S.J.R.34 remove FCC regulations requiring ISPs to keep your internet browsing data, as well as data regarding app usage on mobile devices, private. Data can be sold without your permission. Passed 215-205.

6/8/2017-vote AYE on H.R.10 Financial CHOICE Act of 2017 weakening the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, the Financial Stability Oversight Council, and regulations that prevent commercial banks from trading for their own gain. Passed 233-186.

9/28/2017-vote AYE on H.R.2792 Control Unlawful Fugitive Felons Act of 2017 Current law already terminates Social Security and retirement benefits for fugitive felons. This bill expands the benefit cutoff to include anyone with an unresolved run in with the justice system based on allegation without conviction-including those who may be victims of identity theft. Passed 244-171.

10/3/2017-vote AYE on H.R.36 Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act which bans and criminalizes abortions after 20 weeks of pregnancy. Passed 237-189.

12/6/2017-vote AYE **AND COSPONSORS** H.R.38 Concealed Carry Reciprocity Act of 2017 which allows any person with a concealed carry permit from one state to carry their weapon in any other state AND allow carrying weapons on any federal land, like national parks or national monuments. Passed 231-198.

12/19/2017-vote AYE on H.R.1 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act which gives substantial and PERMANENT cuts to the wealthiest individuals and corporations, removes the Affordable Care Act's individual mandate and increases the deficit by over \$1.4 TRILLION. It caps previously unlimited state and local tax deductions at \$10,000 (which could seriously impact Illinois residents) and limit the mortgage-interest deduction. The bill includes a provision to permit oil drilling in 1.5 million acres of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.
12/21/2017-vote NO on H.R.4667 providing supplemental appropriations for disaster assistance for Hurricane Harvey, Irma, and Maria, and calendar year 2017 wildfires.
Passed 251-169

2018-115th Congress

2/8/2018-vote AYE on H.R.1153 Mortgage Choice Act of 2017 returns consumers to the days before the Dodd-Frank legislation. Passed 280-131.

2/14/2018-vote AYE on H.R.3299 Protecting Consumers' Access to Credit Act of 2017 which permits nonbank financial institutions to charge interest rates that exceed state caps if a bank makes a valid loan and then sells or transfers the loan to a nonbank. Can encourage banks to make loans they would not ordinarily make if they know they will be transferring the loan. Passed 245-171.

Rep. Randy Hultgren was ranked the **2nd most conservative representative** compared to the Illinois Delegation. He has joined bipartisan bills the **5th least often** compared to Illinois Delegation. He has cosponsored the **5th fewest bills** compared to the Illinois Delegation. He has held a leadership position on **0** committees and **1** subcommittee, as either a chair or ranking member at the end of the session.
